I had the opportunity to serve in many positions throughout my law enforcement career to include Patrol Officer/Deputy, Field Training Officer, SWAT Team Operator, Major Crimes Detective, and Captain. I have earned the following college degrees; AAS Administration of Justice (SCC), AA Liberal Arts, BA Criminal Justice (WSU), and Master's in Management (Faulkner University). In 2022, I attended the prestigious FBI National Academy where I earned a Master's in Leadership Certificate from the University of Virgina.

The Police Records Unit is responsible for greeting and working with the public. Police Clerks maintain records, provide fingerprinting services, issue concealed pistol licenses, maintain evidence and seized property, provide data entry; enter court orders and assist with statistical data research.
